ABOUT THE ARTISTS



Classical guitarist **Marc Garvin** is a soloist, chamber music performer, public speaker and well-known instructor. He performs regularly with the Houston Symphony, Houston Grand Opera and Houston Ballet. His enthusiasm and musicality has charmed audiences throughout the United States and Canada. In addition, Marc taught at the 2015 and 2016 Summer Guitar Conservatory's program for student guitarists in Houston.

Public performances have included several appearances with Kevin Riehle's *Cantare Houston*. Additional performances have included Houston Grand Opera's premier of *Pieces of 9/11: Memories from Houston*. This seven-part song cycle written by Jake Heggie (*Dead Man Walking, Three Decembers, Moby Dick*) and librettist Gene Scheer

(*Three Decembers, Moby Dick*) fused stories from those who were affected by, or responded to, the tragic events of September 11, 2001. Other recent performances include, Mario Castelnuovo-Tedesco's "Romancero Gitano" with The University of Houston's chamber choir and The Rob Seible singers. He has given solo and duo recitals at the Classical Minds Guitar Festival and as part of the Texas Music Festival at the University of Houston. Marc was a featured soloist with the Houston Symphony in July of 2010 for its "Final Fantasy" concert. In December of 2009, he played three sold out performances with the Houston Chamber Choir at the prestigious Chapel of the Villa de Matel.

As a graduate with a degree in music from Carnegie-Mellon University, Marc has placed a high emphasis on music education. He currently teaches a full schedule of students at his private studio as well as at St. Francis Episcopal Day School. As a college professor, Mr. Garvin has been on the faculties of Carnegie-Mellon University, Houston Baptist University, Lamar University, Houston Community College and San Jacinto Jr. College. He has also worked as an artist on the roster of Young Audiences of America, and was an active teaching artist for the Texas Institute for Arts in Education. Many of his students have been accepted into prestigious music schools including The New England Conservatory of Music, The University of Southern California's Thornton School of Music, The Butler School of Music at The University of Texas, The University of Miami's Frost School of Music and The Beinen School of Music at Northwestern University.



Harpist **Echo Shen** is an active musician here in Houston. Classically trained to a very high standard, she has performed at many prestigious venues world-wide, and performs regularly for weddings and corporate events in top hotels. She has performed numerous private events and is known for her variety of musical styles, with an extensive repertoire ranging from classical, baroque, jazz, folk, Broadway show tunes to the most current popular hits.

Echo has appeared on Fox Local Morning News for the Valentines Special program, and was invited back for

Christmas programs. As a concert musician, Echo has recently performed at the Sydney Opera House in Australia. She has appeared as a soloist with the Norrköping Symphony Orchestra in Sweden, engaged in numerous concerts at the Beijing Music Festival and performed with the China Philharmonic Orchestra. She has also played with the Tulsa Opera, Cleveland Pops Orchestra, Shreveport Symphony Orchestra, Houston Doctors Orchestra, Houston Children's Chorus, Cantare Houston, Laredo Philharmonic and the South Bend Symphony Orchestra.

A native of Beijing, China, Echo began studying the harp at the age of eleven. After receiving her diploma with honors from Interlochen Arts Academy in Michigan, she attended the Salzedo Harp Colony in Camden, Maine. Echo holds a Bachelor of Music from Cleveland Institute of Music and a Master of Music from the Shepherd School of Music at Rice University where she studied with Houston Symphony harpist Paula Page. Her other teachers have included Alice Chalifoux, Yolanda Kondonassis, Suzann Davids and Joan Holland.
