SOLERO FLAMENCO

Solero Flamenco, Houston's premier flamenco performance company, has brought flamenco to Houston audiences since 2009 in performances brimming with artistic integrity and characteristic passion. Soulful song, enchanting guitar and exhilarating dance converge in this highly improvised art form to present traditional, contemporary and original works. Under the founding artistic direction of **Irma La Paloma** (cante) and **Jeremías García** (guitarra), Solero Flamenco maintains an active performance and production calendar often sharing the stage with local and international artists. Whether in the theater, concert hall, or other venues, audiences experience the heart, soul and skill of professional flamenco artists.

ABOUT FLAMENCO

Flamenco is a mixture of musical influences from Indian, Byzantine, Arabic, Jewish, and Andalusian cultures present in the south of Spain before and after the Reconquista (718-1492). People of varied origins, many from the Punjab region, traveled across the Asian, European, and African continents before settling in Andalucía. They brought their musical cultures as well as those experiences collected through their migratory plight. First in song, then in dance, and later with the incorporation of the guitar, flamenco gave expression to the outcry and hope of a subjugated people. It was not until it's Golden Era, (1869-1910) when flamenco was presented in Café Cantantes, that it became an accepted and established cultural and musical art form.

Flamenco stirs the senses with passion and rhythm. The cante (song) tells the story and is at the core of the art form. The guitar accompanies the song and the baile (dance) in rhythmic harmony. The dance is a unique expression in movement with its characteristic form. Improvisation plays a key role in the seamless communication between song, guitar and dance. Flamenco has transcended time and frontiers. The folklore of the Andalusian gypsies is a living art of global appeal. In November, 2010, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) recognized flamenco as a World Heritage Treasure and Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

IRMA LA PALOMA delivers cante with great integrity, elegance and sincerity. Her heritage and musical intuition are present in her phrasing, rhythmic dexterity and repertoire of flamenco, traditional Spanish folk songs, and original compositions. Born of Spanish descent in Havana, Cuba, Irma began her flamenco journey at the Escuela de Baile Monterroso y Antas de Ulla under the direction of Spain's María Asela Bermúdez. She performed flamenco and Spanish regional dances in Havana's Centro Gallego and Teatro García Lorca. In 1970 her family established residence in Madrid, Spain, where she was further embraced by her heritage. They later came to the US, where she continued to receive dance instruction. Her father's love of poetry and her passion for song and lyrics led her to concentrated study of cante and flamenco dance accompaniment.

She has performed and collaborated with renowned artists in the flamenco genre as well as in theatrical and symphonic performances. In March 2017 she was invited to sing various pieces from De Falla's *El amor brujo* with the Helena Symphony Orchestra in Montana under the direction of Maestro Allan R. Scott, and she recently appeared in the opening of *Lorca and You: The Year of Federico García Lorca* here in Houston.

In March 2013 Irma was honored by *Sucesos* newspaper and *Solo Mujeres* magazine as one of the 24 most influential Hispanic women in Houston and was recognized as Hispanic Woman of the Year in the Arts. Drawing on her professional experience and Bachelor's Degree in International Finance and Marketing from the University of Miami, Florida, Irma is Co-Director of the Houston Spanish and Flamenco Festival in collaboration with San Jacinto College and the Consulate General of Spain in Houston. The festival has garnered recognition from Houston mayors, the Texas House and Senate, and was awarded funding from the National Endowment for the Arts for six years. Future projects include recording of an album and publication of her poetic works.

JEREMÍAS GARCÍA is a classically trained guitarist and composer who has made a successful transition to flamenco. Originally self-taught, he earned a Bachelor's degree in Classical Guitar Performance at Texas A&M University – Corpus Christi under the mentorship of Philip Hii, and a Master's degree from Southern Methodist University in Dallas, where he studied with Robert Guthrie. His début as a classical concert artist at Texas A & M — televised by ABC — led to memorable professional collaborations and performances. As a soloist, he performed Joaquín Rodrigo's *Concierto de Aranjuez* in 2006 with the Fort Bend Symphony, and in 2007 with the Brazosport Symphony. This was also the début performance of his original concerto for two guitars and orchestra *Concierto Nuevo Flamenco*. In March 2017 Jeremy García and Solero Flamenco were featured artists of the Helena Symphony Orchestra in Montana under the direction of conductor Allan R. Scott, for whom García composed and arranged his *Suite Andaluz* for cante, guitarra, baile and full orchestra.

Complementing his classical education and love of the music of Spain, Jeremy received training from master flamenco guitarist Juan Serrano and other renowned tocaores. Jeremy accompanies cante and dance with the sensitivity and dynamics that are integral to the tradition of flamenco. He has enjoyed accompanying flamenco artists such as Antonio Hidalgo, Timo Lozano, Antonio Arrebola, Teo Morca and Pilar Andújar in performances, and artists such as La Tania, Jesús Montoya, Omayra Amaya and Domingo Ortega in workshops.

Jeremy has released two albums: García y Reyna's *Baile del Sol* and Café Khytaro's *Distancia*, featuring his original compositions in collaboration with other artists. With García y Reyna, which he co-founded, he has performed in California, New Mexico, New York City, the Vail, Colorado International Dance Festival, and in Las Vegas. In 2013 Jeremy accompanied soprano Ann Moss in two pieces for her début album *Currents*, recorded at Skywalker Studios, California.

In 2011 Jeremy García and Irma La Paloma co-founded the Houston Spanish and Flamenco Festival in collaboration with San Jacinto College and the Consulate General of Spain in Houston with funding awarded from the National Endowment for the Arts. The festival provides educational, artistic and cultural opportunities for art students, aficionados and the general public.

Jeremy García is Professor of Music and Director of Guitar Studies at San Jacinto College, Central Campus, in Pasadena, Texas. He also teaches private lessons and guitar workshops while keeping an active performance schedule both as soloist and with Solero Flamenco.
